

Rockingham County sees 20 percent more home sales in 2019's fourth quarter

More than 250 homes sold during the fourth quarter of last year

ROCKINGHAM COUNTY (January 17, 2020) – More and more homes are being sold in Rockingham County.

There were 258 homes sold in the county during 2019's fourth quarter, a 20.6 percent increase over the same time the previous year. There was also 205 pending sales, an increase of 13.3 percent.

The average sales price in Rockingham County in the fourth quarter of 2019 was \$152,975, a 12.7 percent increase from the same time in 2018. Median home sales were at \$137,900, an increase of 15.6 percent.

The housing supply was at 2.8 months, a 36.4 percent decrease compared to the same time in 2018.
