Homes are selling at a rapid pace in Rockingham County. Now is a great time to sell!

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ROCKINGHAM COUNTY, N.C. – Fewer homes are going on the market in Rockingham County, but more are being sold and the average sales price continues to increase, according to statistics provided by Triad MLS.

“Homes are selling at a rapid pace,” said Kris Cayton, chair of the Rockingham County Council at the Greensboro Regional REALTORS® Association. “It’s a great time to list your home for sale.”

There were 275 new home listings in Rockingham County during the third quarter of 2020, a decrease of 19.4 percent from the third quarter of 2019.

But there were 263 homes sold, an increase of 11.9 percent compared to this time last year.

The average sales price climbed 23.0 percent to \$186,390 during this year’s third quarter in Rockingham County.

The county’s housing supply dropped 51.3 percent to 1.9 months.

“Supply of inventory is a problem,” Cayton said. “With the lack of supply, we have seen an increase in the average sales price. It’s a great time to list your home.”
