Average sales price of a Rockingham County home increases 15% in 2020

‘Interest rates are low and the lack of inventory is pushing prices up’

ROCKINGHAM COUNTY, N.C. – The average sales price of a home in Rockingham County home went up by more than 15 percent in 2020, according to statistics provided by Triad MLS.

The average sales price of a single family Rockingham County home was \$173,177 last year, an increase of 15.4 percent over \$150,080 in 2019.

“It’s absolutely a good time to sell,” said Kris Cayton, chair of the Rockingham County Council at the Greensboro Regional REALTORS® Association. “Interest rates are low and the lack of inventory is pushing prices up.”

There were 917 homes sold in Rockingham County last year, a slight 2.2 percent drop from the 938 sold in 2019.

Homes sold fast last year. It took 48 days on average to sell a Rockingham County home in 2020. That’s a decrease of 27.3 percent compared to 66 days in 2019.
